I am pleased that the goal of the Past Exalted Rulers Association was met. The next Officer Corps will consist of seasoned members with a mix of new members. Our Lodge is in good hands for the future, new members serving bring new energy and fresh ideas. As always, the past Exalted Rulers Association will be there to assist our new Officers and we wish them much success.

It is with gratitude that I thank the Past Exalted Rulers who have served our Lodge these past three years, I thank the members who have served their Lodge as an activity chairman and to the membership at large who have participated in our activities, especially our volunteers who give so much of their time and effort to the Lodge in so many ways.

Several goals have been met:

We have increased our membership by 142 members. Thank you sponsors.

We have reduced our lapsation rate to 2%, meeting the goal set by Grand Lodge.

We have supported more Elk programs than we had been able to during the past several years, including meeting the per capita goal of both the Elks National Foundation and our State Major Project, the "piggy bank program". "Elks Care, Elks Share".

We opened our Lodge in grand style with a day of rededication, and welcomed back many members that we have not seen in several years.

Little by little we were able to open our Club operation, providing meal service Tuesday through Friday with Saturday tacos.

Our social programs were reinstated and well attended.

The building delays caused many problems. We are still meeting with the University Housing Authority on a regular basis over workmanship details. Many changes and corrections have been made to the building since opening and I am pleased to report that we are making progress on our punch list items but there is still much to do.

This month we are finally going to see an American flag flying on our property as the work on our first cell tower is about complete.

This being my final letter, it is important for me to express my deepest gratitude to my wife Pat, the First Lady of Fullerton Lodge these past two years, for all she has endured during my periods of frustration, for supporting me to do the job, for supporting the Lodge as I have, for being my "reminder" when I was such a "forgetter", for being a wonderful greeter to all our members, for agreeing to be our First Lady for two years but mostly for being the lady I love. Thank you!

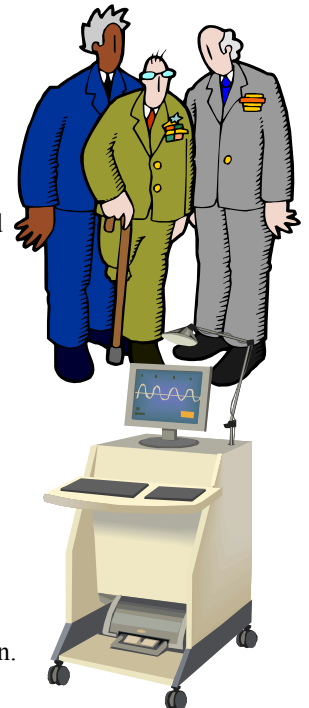

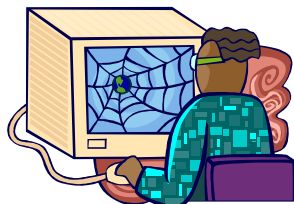

Proposed House Rules changes as approved by the Fullerton Elks House Committee, 01/14/2009

4. No member shall be permitted to reprimand, instruct or discharge employees of the club. All complaints whatsoever, concerning the employees or regarding their service, shall be made to the manager or designated representative in person, or to the house committee either in person or in writing. The members are requested to notify the manager of any lack of courtesy or dereliction in the performance of duties on the part of any employee.

Add to the end of the paragraph;

Employees should report to the manager or Duty Officer, at the earliest moment, any behavior of a member unbecoming an Elk.

14. No non-members are allowed in our lodge or club after 6:00pm on meeting night, Thursdays, except on pre-designated occasions or employees on duty.

Change to, "after 7:30pm on meeting night

This change would allow family members to join the member for dinner on this evening.

22. All beverages consumed by anyone while on Lodge property, or within our club, must be procured from our bar.

Change to; All beverages consumed by anyone while on Lodge property, or within our club, must be procured from our bar or decanted with the required corkage fee by our service staff.

28. No beverages or food may be taken into the bingo area from the club dining room or lounge during bingo nights.

Eliminate until such time bingo may be reinstated.

29. Only first party checks will be cashed. Checks will not be cashed in excess of \$50.00 in any 24 hour period.

Cashing of such checks must be approved by the club manager or designated representative, or in their absence, by a member of the house committee. Any invalid checks issued or cashed by a member will be subject to a service charge of \$\$25.00.

Adding "checks will be accepted only from members of Fullerton Lodge."

Changing service charge from \$25.00 to \$30.00

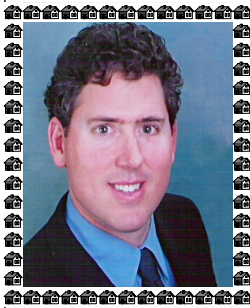
